NEW - Internship and Workforce Training

We welcome Scandinavians to the state of Georgia and Americans to the Nordic Countries to participate in internships and training programs. The SAFG, supports various participants, by making it possible for them to acquire hands-on experience and gain new skills and knowledge. There has been more than 16,000 interns and trainees since the American-Scandinavian Foundation initiated this program in 1949. Scandinavian interns and trainees gain valuable professional experience, build beneficial relationships, and learn American business techniques to be applied upon returning to their home countries. Students and young professionals participate in a wide range of fields from engineering to fashion. Each participant is welcomed by the host firm as a member of the team and receives a direct, personal introduction to the American practice of his or her professional field. The SAFG is grateful to the many American businesses and organizations that make it possible for these interns and trainees to acquire hands-on experience and gain new skills and knowledge. The collaboration of the SAFG and other Nordic cooperating organizations is also an indispensable part of the program and is very much appreciated. The SAFG is now seeking Intern & Trainee hosting firms in the state of Georgia.

TransAtlantic Education Leadership Exchange (TELE)

SAFG participated in TransAtlantic Education Leadership Exchange (TELE) 2015 in Atlanta. The TELE 2015 Symposium was the first event of its kind in the U.S. and was intended to begin an important dialogue between Americans and Scandinavians. The symposium featured a panel of educators and experts from the Nordic countries along with the leading American experts on early childhood development, and offered keynote presentations, panel discussions, and small break-out sessions. Attendees included practitioners and academics in the field of early childhood education from across the state of Georgia and Finland. The conference was co-hosted by SAFG.

Music & Performing Arts Music programs

Programs range from classical to contemporary, jazz, and new indie music. Performers and fellows studying music and performing arts programs.

Lectures & Symposia Lectures

SAFG continues to bring together Americans and Scandinavians to learn about and discuss a wide variety of topics and issues. These ranged from the future of the Arctic to emerging Finnish architecture, from Viking settlements in North America to contemporary Nordic crime fiction, from classical to emerging writers, and from economics to public affairs. Lecture series are presented in conjunction with exhibitions and symposiums.

Language Classes

Classes in Danish, Finnish, Icelandic, Norwegian, and Swedish are offered in conjunction with our volunteers and other organizations.

Publishing

SAFG Social Media platform, serves information exchange between SAFG members, donors, friends, patrons, and others interested in the Nordic region. The SAFG presents a variety of articles on life and culture in the Nordic countries along with presentations on current exhibitions and history. We encourage participation from our community - column featuring news and information of interest to SAFG community.
